



The Personal Space Neighborhood

Personal space is what helps people feel comfortable and safe.




Look at this city. The buildings are close together.

Sometimes people need less personal space and others prefer more space.




No matter the amount of personal space you have or prefer, make sure you are a good neighbor.






Good neighbors keep themselves and their things in their own space.

Good neighbors do not take or borrow things without asking or go near the teacher's things.




Good neighbors know they are too close when someone backs up.




Good neighbors also make sure not to take up too much personal space.

a toy someone else is playing with.




Good neighbors know when they aren't playing with a toy anymore, it's okay for someone else to use it.

personal space neighborhood do!




